





Summary compared to previous week: Transmission trending below 1.0; consecutive nine-day descent ended, third day of uptick; case investigation goal met; testing turn around average lowered due to one major data point – median is 2 days; hospitals back to 1:1 county:out-of-county admits and descent less than case descent; Missoula remains below state average on incidence at lowest among large seven counties. Halving continues and has increased to 68 days from previous 58. Largest daily new cases received since start of descent.
